Evolution or Revolution?

- Modern (formerly Metro) apps in window
- “Tablet mode”
- Continuum
- Cortana – virtual assistant, may have privacy implications
- Start Menu / Start Screen hybrid
- Hardened security
- Microsoft Edge web browser, Internet Explorer soon to be deprecated
- Reduced footprint / recovery files

It's not feature creep!

- DirectX 12 – even with same hardware, faster gaming and visualization
- USB 3.1 and ThunderBolt 3 – great for future tablets, laptops, phones
- Universal apps – including Xbox
- Major accessibility improvements
- Better OneDrive sync and cloud hooks – not finished at RTM
- WinFS is still missing from the Vista days
- Slight improvement in home sharing, but more promised free later

STOP – Do you require Media Center?

If you use the DVR / Cable Card feature of Media Center in Windows 8 or previous, STOP!

If you like the Program Guide feature of Media Center, STOP!

If you upgrade to Windows 10, you will irreversibly lose those features. At the moment there are NO KNOWN WORKAROUNDS.

There ARE replacements for DVD playback from Media Center.

Before the plunge: BACKUP

- **Yeah yeah, I have a backup.**
Are you sure? Make sure it is on separate media, and critical files should be in a couple different PLACES
- Acronis True Image, Macrium Reflect Free, other images? YES
- Trust the cloud? Maybe. I do for non-urgent things that would not destroy me if they got out to the press.
- Backblaze, CrashPlan Pro, Mozy? Still do a local backup before an upgrade or reload. Restoring from these are SLOW.

Reload or Upgrade?

My “rule of thumb”:

If my Windows install is older than 12 months, it is worth 4-6 hours to reload. I find I get much better results reloading periodically.

Tempered by: I do not have that many apps, and I keep track of what I install using OneNote for easy reloading. All I really have to worry about are Security/Encryption and copying my documents back. Media is stored on a separate partition.

Reloading with the free 7/8.1 upgrade?

Unfortunately, the free offer will require you to upgrade from your current operating system FIRST before reloading.

If you reload without upgrading, Windows 10 may prompt you for a key, and your existing Windows 7 and 8.1 keys will not work! If this happens and it is not possible to upgrade, calling Microsoft Support will be necessary!

If planning to use the free offer, upgrade your current system FIRST.

If you upgrade from Windows 7 or 8.1...

- 1) BACKUP
- 2) PATCH Windows (Windows Update) AND critical apps first
- 3) DO NOT RUSH – July 29 will probably be a swamp
- 4) DO NOT DO IT BEFORE A TRIP
- 5) DO NOT DO IT BEFORE A MAJOR PROJECT / HUGE HONEY DO LIST
- 6) DO NOT DO IT WHEN A THUNDERSTORM IS PREDICTED

(...) seriously, most upgrades do go just fine, but think about timing.

What about privacy?

Definitely more chatty back to Microsoft and other vendors

Cortana being enabled constantly checks for new messages, similar to Google Now.

Not everyone will be comfortable with this!

The Windows 10 Road

- NOT FINISHED - Probably obvious (Settings vs Control Panel, et al)
- Free feature upgrades through 2020, security through 2025
- “Redstone” in 6 months, hopefully improved tablet mode
- Free Windows 7 and 8.1 upgrades to Windows 10 until 28-July-2016, may sit on the fence for a bit, but set a calendar reminder!
- Windows Server 2016 coming soon with Windows 10 interface improvements, not a free upgrade!

The Microsoft Edge Road

- NOT FINISHED – no extensions (Fall 2015?)
- FAST, will adding missing features slow it down?
- Separate app, unlike Internet Explorer, so it will be upgraded separately and frequently
- Is it compelling? For me it replaced Internet Explorer 100% but not yet my “daily driver”

Not impressed?

Apple Mac OS X (I still love the font rendering on Mac)

Linux

Abandoning “thick” computing altogether for Android, ChromeOS, iOS

Safe to stay with Windows 7 and 8.1 for another few years:
