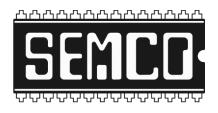

File Organization and The Cloud 1/3

Organization for you, family, colleagues, and perhaps those that come after you

Search engines like Apple's Spotlight, Google Desktop, Windows (Bing) Search help, but sometimes are let downs. Although, try Office Delve!

Often the old "tried and true" folder organization works best, but also consider file naming and tags, where usable.

INTERLUDE

The best time to organize something is AT INCEPTION when the document/file is created.

File Organization and The Cloud 2/3

Consider folders like:

- -- IN PROCESS DUE THIS WEEK –
- -- NEEDS BACKUP --

Documents – HIGHLY CONFIDENTIAL

Documents – OK to share

(or the equivalent tags if you are comfortable with those)

File Organization and The Cloud 3/3

"The Cloud" in the title – what is the tie in?

This same organization is necessary there, even with new-fangled "Object Storage".

Some cloud services offer terabytes of space at very low cost. Not being organized means chaos, and could prevent using them to their full potential.

Cloud Services for File Storage 1/5

Personal Clouds (those you run yourself):

BTSync

OwnCloud

Some NAS devices such as FreeNAS, QNAP, Synology

Commercial:

Amazon, BackBlaze*, CrashPlan*, DropBox, Google Drive, Mozy*, OneDrive, OneDrive for Business, SpiderOak, Wuala

Cloud Services for File Storage 2/5

Wuala is an example of a cloud service that ended. Didn't download your files from there? OUCH.

Lesson: keep an eye on cloud services you do not run yourself, and for critical data, keep your own copies. Be prepared, if a service ends or changes service terms, to rapidly move data off – which could be costly and time-consuming.

(run your own cloud service? Well, be careful, what happens if your server fails? Keep copies of critical data elsewhere OFFLINE!)

Rolling your own – Cloud 3/5

BTSync, OwnCloud, and having a couple NAS systems often is enough to serve your family or another small group. Costs are minimal.

Advantages: can be secured via your own encryption, and as long as you keep the services up to date, are highly secure and competitive.

Disadvantages: expensive to scale. Jeff has ~~10TB of personal materials, next step up is quite expensive, even as storage has continued to get less expensive. Some families need LOTS of TB's.

Public Cloud & Security 4/5

Consider using encrypted disk images, like VeraCrypt (Linux/Windows), Apple "sparse disk images" procedures are easily available. Complicates mobile / tablet access, and is probably only needed for sensitive materials, but keep in mind that even pictures in the public cloud can reveal where you live/travel/friends/fraudulent passport photos if they get out.

Be sure to back up critical keys and passphrases for encrypted materials in password vaults, and <u>for critical materials</u>, <u>both keys and the actual</u> <u>disk images should be backed up somewhere OFFLINE</u>.

Jeff & The Public Cloud 5/5

As shown in the demo, I do not believe in a single provider at present.

I used to use Wuala, and it's gone!

So, I have some stuff in Dropbox, some in Google Drive, some in OneDrive, and some on my own cloud. Some in encrypted disks on each service. My family has the keys to all in an emergency.

Using folder organization and hints in my password vault, I know what is where! <u>Please diversify and be careful with public cloud passwords</u>.

PowerShell Quickie! 1/2

Windows 8.1, Windows 10, Windows Server 2012R2 and 2016 may be <u>totally</u> administered using PowerShell.

Replaces .BAT files and is extensible. Automate services, system rebuilds, complex network share creation/updating, and remote access

Unfortunately, DOES NOT look like Linux/Unix style scripting, although there are resources to adapt.

Easy cut/paste at LAST! If you have pasted into cmd.exe-it's better!
